1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Henry Dupre, Vice Chairman; Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Booster Breaux.  
Committee members recorded as absent were: Mr. Ron Alcorn, Mr. Martin Triche.  
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Chris Carter, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve the bills submitted through March 8, 2019." The motion was unanimously adopted.
3. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve and authorize Paul LeBlanc to sign purchase orders and invoices." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Vice Chairman Henry Dupre recognized Paul Leblanc, who stated that the low bidder didn't meet the specifications required for the trash bag bid. He stated that he spoke with the ADA regarding the matter and he advised that the next bidder be recommended. Therefore he recommended that the Police Jury accept the next lowest responsible bid from Economical Wholesale for the trash bags.
5. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, the committee approve to accept next responsible low bidder, Economical Wholesale, for the annual trash bag bid." The motion was unanimously adopted.
6. Vice Chairman Henry Dupre recognized Paul LeBlanc, who stated that the current dump truck was purchased in 2014 therefore he would like to go out for bids to purchase a new truck. He stated that the cost ranges from \$125,000-130,000. In response, the Secretary-Treasurer stated that piggy backing is no longer allowed. She then informed the committee that the funds are in the budget.
7. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve and authorize the Parish Manager to go out for bids for a dump truck." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Finance Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

Drainage Committee Meeting

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Henry Dupre, Chairman; Mr. Chris Carter, Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne, Committee member recorded as absent was. Mr. Martin Triche. Other Police Juror recorded as present was: Mr. Jeff Naquin.
2. Chairman Henry Dupre recognized Mr. Irving Comeaux, who stated that the drainage canal on Sophie St. drains from Lafourche Parish to Hwy 398. He proceeded to explain what was previously done to hold back the water from entering the canal. Following a brief discussion, the ADA asked for specifics showing that this is a drainage matter, serves a public purpose and will alleviate the problem. In response, Chairman Henry Dupre stated that the bulkhead will prevent the silting and filling in of the canal which will prevent erosion. He then suggested that the project be bid out and then a decision can be made to have it done.
3. Committee member Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve to bid out the bulkhead for Sophie St." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Committee member Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Chris Carter, "THAT, the committee approves \$300 for Louis Lane Outfall Sweeping Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Chairman Henry Dupre recognized the Parish Engineer, who explained that there are two (2) lift gates and culverts running under Oakley Rd. and one (1) is failing which doesn't allow you to regulate the water. He stated that this water goes to the Marais pump therefore if you can control the water flow you would prevent the water from flooding the pump. In addition, the Parish Engineer stated that those flood gates are very old and need to be repaired.
6. Committee member Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve \$700 for Oakley Rd. Lift Gates & Bulkhead Repair Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
7. Committee member Chris Carter offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve \$1,580 for Lower Texas and Marais Canals Dirt Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. Chairman Henry Dupre stated that the request for a letter to the State regarding the ditching in our area has been sent numerous times and to no avail. A brief discussion was then held regarding the request and the speedy response by DOTD in other parishes. Following the discussion, the committee agreed to send the letter and also invite the State Engineer and the Legislative Delegation to an upcoming meeting.
9. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the committee approve sending a letter to the State Engineer and the Legislative Delegation expressing the dissatisfaction with the back log of ditching in Assumption Parish and invite them to a meeting to further discuss the matter." The motion was unanimously adopted.
10. Committee member Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Chris Carter, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Drainage Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

Engineering/Grants Committee Meeting

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Chairman; Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Jeff Naquin.  
Committee members recorded as absent were: Mr. Ron Alcorn, Mr. Martin Triche.  
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Chris Carter, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OHSEP Director, who proceeded with the following update on all Disaster Recover Grants:
  - Cancienne Canal Project – The review appraiser continues to work through the original appraisal to meet the federal guidelines. If the review appraiser can't, we will have to get another appraiser.
  - Marais Sewer Project – The Contractor has begun his submittal process on the project to the Parish Engineer who is currently reviewing them. Once the submittals are reviewed then a notice to proceed will be given to the contractor to get started. Hopefully it will be completed by the end of the year.
  - Sewer Generator Project – The Contractor has begun his submittal process on the project to the Parish Engineer who is currently reviewing them. The generators have been ordered off of State Bid contract and are expected within 90-120 days.
  - Linear Park – There is no update.
  - Wastewater Generator Project – Goes along with the CDBG Project.
  - Hazardous Mitigation Project – The application has been submitted to construct the safe room at the Waterworks but no request has been received from FEMA as of yet.
  - Mosquito Abatement Lab – It's located on Hwy 1008 and completed. He stated the inspection will take place on tomorrow. Once that's complete, Mr. Clement will begin moving in after the certificate of occupancy is received.
3. Committee member Martin Triche entered the meeting at this time.
4. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, 'THAT, the committee approve adding the following matter to the agenda.' The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Committee member Jeff Naquin stated that the Brule/Labadieville Boat Landing Project was underestimated due to the high water. He explained that a 30 ft. slab was put but the project really needed 40 ft. He stated that he received complaints all weekend long. Therefore, the Parish Engineer contacted the contractor and got an estimated quote of \$7,500 to correct the length. In response, the Parish Engineer stated that this was an existing limestone launch and in this case they were trying to create a hard bottom so they poured a slab down the existing slope. However, the way in which the boats were launching this slab no longer allowed them to do so. He then explained how the contractor would correct the project and stated that the cost is reasonable.  
Committee member Jeff Naquin stated that over half of his constituents use this launch so he will allocate one-half of the cost from his recreation funds.
6. Chairman Irving Comeaux requested comments, questions or concerns regarding the Brule/Labadieville Boat Landing Project. Following three (3) calls, there were no comments.
7. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, 'THAT, the committee approve \$7,500, 1/2 from Ward 2 & 3 recreation allocations,, for Brule/Labadieville Boat Landing Project.' The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, 'THAT, there being no further business to come before the Engineering/Grants Committee, the meeting be adjourned.' The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. The Regular Meeting of the Assumption Parish Police Jury was called to order by Police Jury President Martin Triche in the Assumption Parish Police Jury Chamber located at 4813 Highway 1, Napoleonville, Louisiana.
2. Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Jeff Naquin, Ward 2; Mr. Irving Comeaux, Ward 3; Mr. Martin Triche, Ward 5; Mr. Chris Carter, Ward 6; Mr. Henry Dupre, Ward 7; Mr. Booster Breaux, Ward 8; Mr. Myron Matherne, Ward 9.  
Police Jurors recorded as absent were: Mr. Ron Alcorn, Ward 1; Mr. Patrick Johnson, Ward 4.
3. President Martin Triche led the Prayer and Police Juror Chris Carter led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.
4. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the minutes of February 27, 2019." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. President Martin Triche recognized Finance Committee Vice Chairman Henry Dupre, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters; payment of the bills submitted through March 8, 2019, authorized Paul LeBlanc to sign purchase orders and invoices, accept the next lowest responsible bidder, Economical Wholesale, for the annual trash bag bid and to go out for bids for a dump truck.
6. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Finance Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolutions attached)
7. President Martin Triche recognized Drainage Committee Chairman Henry Dupre, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters: bid out the bulkhead for Sophie St, \$300 for Louis Lane Outfall Sweeping Project, \$700 for Oakley Rd. Lift Gates & Bulkhead Repair Project, \$1,580 for Lower Texas and Marais Canals Dirt Project and send a letter to the State Engineer and the Legislative Delegation expressing the dissatisfaction with the back log of ditching in Assumption Parish and invite them to a meeting to further discuss the matter.
8. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Carter, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Drainage Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted.
9. President Martin Triche recognized the Engineering/Grants Committee Chairman Irving Comeaux, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters: received an update on the Disaster Recovery Grants and allocated \$7,500, ½ from Wards 2 & 3 recreation allocations, for the Brule/Labadieville Boat Landing Project
10. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Engineering/Grants Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted (resolution attached)
11. President Martin Triche opened the meeting to the public for any public comments, questions or concerns regarding the items listed on the agenda. He recognized Ashley Morris, Attorney, 1505 North 19<sup>th</sup> St., Monroe, LA, who stated that on behalf of her client, U.S. Bank National Association, who acquired the property through foreclosure in November, she understands that there are procedures for a demolition hearing. She proceeded to state that they are currently wrapping up litigation in the foreclosure suit and the filing was done today. In response, the ADA stated that he discussed the matter with Ms. Morris and the comment made was that as long as this was being put back into the commerce and insured there would be no reason not to approve her extension without date. He stated that they have moved into the direction of a new buyer for the property at which time it would be expeditiously cleaned up at their cost and not the Parish. In response, Police Juror Chris Carter accepts as long as the clean-up is done in a timely matter. In response, Ms. Morris stated that they don't anticipate the defendant contesting it so it can roughly take about 6 weeks but it's however long the Judge takes to set a hearing date and issue a ruling thereafter. She further stated that they have a contract for a buyer. President Martin Triche stated that accepting the low bid follows with demolition, the lien will hold up the process and delay everything. The ADA requested that a copy of the purchase agreement be sent to the Parish so communications with the potential buyer can transpire and they will be aware of the Parish's intentions and the matter can be expeditiously handled.
12. Following three (3) calls, there were no further comments received.
13. President Martin Triche proceeded to read resolution No. 1, adopt the millage rates for the tax year 2019.

14. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Chris Carter, "THAT, the Police Jury approve and adopt the millage rates for the tax year 2019 (Resolution No 1)." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
15. President Martin Triche proceeded to read resolution No. 2, adopt the other authorized millages and/or taxes for the tax year 2019.
16. Police Juror Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Chris Carter, "THAT, the Police Jury approve and adopt the other authorized millages and/or taxes for the tax year 2019 (Resolution No. 2)." The motion was unanimously adopted (resolution attached)
17. President Martin Triche recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who stated that ordinance 19-01 was adopted in January to change the polling place location from St. Elizabeth School to St. Augustine Church Hall. She stated that the precinct was identified as 3A and should have been precinct 3 therefore, the State is recommending that it be amended so that it be clarified from this point on.
18. Police Juror Chris Carter offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve amending ordinance 19-01 section 2:52 polling places from ward 6 precinct 3A to ward 6 precinct 3." The motion was unanimously adopted. (ordinance attached)
19. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a Can Shake for Labadieville American Legion Auxiliary Unit 289 (4/13/19)." The motion was unanimously adopted.
20. Police Juror Chris Carter offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve proclaiming April 2019 as Fair Housing Month." The motion was unanimously adopted.
21. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Chris Carter, "THAT, the Police Jury approve an occupational license for Landry's Cajun Sno'balls, Royal Posh One Stop Shop and Busy Bees Lawn Care." The motion was unanimously adopted.
22. President Martin Triche stated that public comments were received regarding the acceptance of the low bid for demolition, removal and disposal of the derelict structure located at 129 Virginia St. He stated that the Attorney on behalf of the homeowner has met with the ADA and Police Juror Carter has no objections to the decision reached to extending the time period as long as the owner moves in expeditious fashion.
23. Police Juror Chris Carter offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve tabling the acceptance of the low bid for demolition, removal and disposal of the derelict structure located at 129 Virginia St." The motion was unanimously adopted.
24. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a light on Lanier St. behind 104 Farm St. " The motion was unanimously adopted.
25. Police Juror Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve adding the following matter to the agenda." The motion was unanimously adopted.
26. President Martin Triche recognized Police Juror Myron Matherne, who requested that a letter be sent to the media stating the due to the high waters Lake Verret/Assumption Parish No Wake Zone are in full affect until further notice.
27. President Martin Triche requested comments, questions, or concerns regarding the request to send a letter to the News Media. He recognized Herbert LeBlanc, Pierre Part, who stated that Ascension and Livingston Parishes are always on the News so if it's mentioned they can't say they were not aware. In response, President Martin Triche stated that the locals are made aware by Facebook but out of town fishermen are unaware before they arrive. It was also stated that everyone doesn't do social media. Following three (3) calls, there were no further comments received.
28. Police Juror Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury authorizes the OEP Office to notify the News Media of the No Wake Zone in Assumption Parish." The motion was unanimously adopted.
29. President Martin Triche recognized the OHSEP Director, who stated that everyone is aware of the rising waters and that the weather affects the water levels. He stated that a cold front will be passing though our area which will be good and switch the winds to the North. This should help the water levels in the entire Lake Verret Basin. He then stated that within the projected forecast of the Atchafalaya the high water will be there for weeks at approximately 8.1 level. In response, he stated that the Atchafalaya of Morgan City is expected to crest by March 15, 2019. The OHSEP Director stated that the Parish has about 1 month of high waters before seeing normal conditions or more rain. He stated that the level at Belle River is at 2.6 and if history repeats

itself, June 2017 was the highest mark since the gauge has been there and it was at 3.29. A brief discussion was then held regarding the roads that are being affected by the rising waters.

30. Police Juror Booster Breaux initiated a brief discussion regarding the dissatisfaction with the road overlay program and the condition of the roads. In response, President Martin Triche suggested that a Road & Bridge meeting be scheduled for the next meeting to identify the issues. He also stated that the ADA should be kept abreast because the way in which this project is going the Parish will withhold a significant amount of the funds and could be headed into the contractor bringing about a claim for compensation. He then stated how poorly the work in the Ward 5 area was done. In response, the Parish Engineer stated that they are well aware of the issues, he has photos and he also has an employee on the site informing them of the dissatisfaction in their work and documenting the matter. He further stated that when an invoice is received and a problem was sited they are withholding an appropriate dollar value from that road and for some the entire amount is withheld. President Martin Triche then suggested that the Parish Engineer present a brief slide show at the next Road & Bridge meeting, have his inspector present with photos so the ADA can be made aware from the beginning to recommend how the Parish should proceed.
31. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Assumption Parish Police Jury, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

**AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 19 - 01**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE PARISH OF ASSUMPTION TO AMEND SECTION 2:52 "POLLING PLACES ESTABLISHED", OF SUB-CHAPTER B, "ELECTIONS" OF CHAPTER 2 OF THE ASSUMPTION PARISH CODE OF ORDINANCES SO AS TO ESTABLISH A NEW POLLING PLACE FOR WARD 6 – PRECINCT 1, WARD 6 PRECINCT 1A and WARD 6 PRECINCT 3.**

Be it enacted by the Police Jury of the Parish of Assumption, convened in Regular Session on January 9, 2019, that Section 2:52, "Polling Places Established", of Sub-Chapter B, "Elections", of Chapter 2 of the Assumption Parish Code of Ordinances be hereby amended so as to establish a new polling place for Ward 6 – Precinct 1, Ward 6 – Precinct 1A and Ward 6 – Precinct 3.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the proper administrative officials of the Parish of ASSUMPTION, State of Louisiana, be and they are hereby empowered, authorized, and directed to spread said taxes, as hereinabove set forth, upon the assessment roll of said Parish for the year 2019, and to make the collection of the taxes imposed for and on behalf of the taxing authority, according to law, and that the taxes herein levied shall become a permanent lien and privilege on all property subject to taxation as herein set forth, and collection thereof shall be enforceable in the manner provided by law.
